

## Please Join the Fibrolamellar Cancer Foundation Biobank

Thank you for considering donating your tumor tissue to the Fibrolamellar Cancer Foundation Biobank! Your contribution can make a meaningful impact on research into fibrolamellar carcinoma - a rare and understudied cancer. Donating tissue does **not** affect your medical care or any research being done at the hospital where your surgery takes place. We only collect tissue that is **not needed** for your treatment and would otherwise be discarded. You can also request that your donation be removed from the biobank at any time.

Our biobank preserves these samples so we can distribute them, **free of charge**, to researchers worldwide who can use them to better understand the disease and develop new treatments.

## How to Contribute Tissue:

If you have an upcoming surgery: Please contact Seth Haddix, our biobank coordinator, as

early as possible. He will guide you through the consent process and coordinate with your hospital to collect any

unused tissue.

If you had surgery in the past: There may still be stored tissue at the hospital where you

were treated. By providing Seth with the date and

location of your past surgery, he can investigate whether

any tissue can be obtained.

## We Make Donations Easy for You.

Once you sign a consent form and provide minimal clinical data, we handle the rest. We'll contact the hospital and manage all logistics related to the tissue transfer. While it's ideal to reach out before surgery, we may still be able to access tissue from past procedures.
